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### What is a Smart Phone?

- A smart phone is a cellular phone that performs many of the functions of a computer.
- Typically having a touchscreen interface Internet access.
- And an operating system capable of running downloaded applications.

## Touch Screen Enabled

- You interact with your device by tapping and sliding your fingertips onto the front surface.
  - You can single tap,
  - Double-tap,
  - Swipe left and right, or up and down,
  - Or pinch your fingers together or slide them apart.

\*\* You can also use a stylus if you have big fingertips or long nails.



# **Tapping Tips**

- Tap and release on an App to Open or to Start that App.
- Press and Hold an App to make it wiggle so that you can rearrange and move it to a different home screen or to a folder.
- Swipe finger down to scroll up / Swipe finger up to scroll down.
- Swipe finger to the left to move right / Swipe finger to the right to move left.
- Pinch your fingers together to zoom out / Start with your fingers together first and then slide them apart to zoom in.
- Double tap to zoom in / Double tap again to zoom out.
- Double tap after typing to make a period.
- Double tap up arrow on keyboard to make Caps Lock.

# Terminology

- Apps short for "applications", are mini-applications or software programs.
- Home Screen the screen or page(s) where your Apps live.
- Network is the company that handles your calls (Verizon, AT&T, Sprint) and provides you with voicemail, texting, voice memos and data transfer.
- SMS (Short Messaging Service) or texting and MMS (Media Messaging Service) photos/videos to other mobile users.
- Wi-Fi is a mechanism for wirelessly connecting electronic devices to the <u>Internet</u> via a <u>hotspot</u>.
  - Hotspot are places with Wi-Fi Internet connectivity.
  - Personal Hotspot allows you to share your Internet connection with your computer via Wi-Fi, Bluetooth , USB or your iPhone.
- **Bluetooth** is a short-range wireless connection (hands-free).

## Your Samsung is an Android

 The Samsung Galaxy S is a touchscreenenabled Android Smartphone designed, developed and marketed by Samsung Electronics.


• It is a Google Smart Phone.

 It comes with Google Voice. Say "OK Google" to ask a question, get directions, set a reminder, whatever you need to do.

You can get Apps from the Play Store.
It has Apps on your Home Screen.

### Getting to Know your Samsung

- Your Samsung has a front, a back, 2 sides, a top and a bottom.
- The Front Face, has only 1 button = The Home Button
  - It also has a list icon and a return icon on either side of the Home Button.
- The Back = a Camera and Flash
- The Top = power switch
- The Side = has volume controls
- The Bottom = where you charge your device and insert earbuds.



## Wi-Fi Setup

- All Digital Devices must be on Wi-Fi to access digital information. **To Set Up Wi-Fi** 1. Tap Settings 2. Tap Wi-Fi **3.** Tap Choose a Network... 4. Tap to type in your Network name and if the network has a baby lock
  - icon > type in your password

## **Status Icons**

The tiny little icons that are located at the very top of every Home Screen that give you information about the status of your signals:

- Airplane mode: shows that airplane mode is on—you cannot use the phone, access the Internet, or use Bluetooth® devices. Non-wireless features are available.
- **Cell signal: vertical** bars or dots that show whether you're in range of the cellular network and can make and receive calls. The more bars or dots the stronger the signal. If there's no signal, the bars are replaced with "No service."
- **3G/4G/EDGE/GPS/E:** shows your carrier's network.
- Wi-Fi: baby rainbow your device is connected to the Internet over a Wireless Network. The more curved lines, the stronger the connection.
- Network activity: represented by a spinning flower, which shows over-theair syncing or other network activity.
- **Time:** shows the time of day.
- **VPN:** shows that you're connected to a Virtual Private Network.
- **Lock:** shows that orientation is locked.
- **Play:** shows that a song, audiobook, or podcast is playing.
- **Alarm:** shows that an alarm is set.
- **Bluetooth:** shows that Bluetooth is active.
- **Battery life:** shows battery % or charging status by a lightning bolt.


## Remember your Passwords

# What is Syncing?

**Syncing** – syncs data between your device and your computer to the cloud and back. The information is stored in 1 place in The Cloud.

There are several Clouds - iCloud (Apple), Gmail (Google), Outlook (Microsoft).

- You can make changes to your address book and the change will Sync the information back to your computer or you can make changes on your computer and sync it back to your Samsung.
- Exchange syncs your Gmail Email, MSN, Yahoo, Live, Outlook.com, Hotmail, Calendar, and Contacts between your Device and The Cloud > @hotmail, @gmail, @msn, @yahoo, @live, @outlook, @icloud.

#### IMAP vs POP Email - <u>www.pop2imap.com/</u>

• **IMAP** (**Internet Message Access Protocol**). **IMAP** allows users to store their email on remote servers. This two-way protocol also allows the user to synchronize their email among multiple devices, which is extremely important today, when most people have at least two devices - their laptop and their smartphone.

# Adding your Email Account

- 1. Start on your Home Screen
- 2. Tap All applications
- 3. Tap Email
- 4. Enter your Email address
- 5. Enter your Email address password
- 6. Tap Manual Setup
- 7. Select the type of account: POP3, IMAP or Exchange

#### **Incoming Server Settings**

- **Email address** = Customer's email address
- **Username** = Customer's username.
- **Password** = Customer's password.
- **POP/IMAP server** = Enter server information (orange.net is pop.orange.net).
- **Security type** = Select from list (orange.net is set to none).
- **Port** = Enter server port details (orange.net is 110).

# Adding your Gmail Email

- **1**. Find the Gmail icon in the Apps list.
- 2. Tap the Gmail icon.
- 3. Tap the Existing button or New (if it doesn't exist yet).
- 4. Enter your existing Gmail user ID and password.
- 5. Tap Done on the keyboard (where your Enter or Return key is usually).



## How to Read your Email

- You're alerted to the arrival of a new Email message by a notification icon on top of the Email App Icon.
- 2. For a new Gmail message tap the Gmail Icon
- 3. For a new Email message tap the Email Icon
- 4. As mail comes into your InBox, you can read it by tapping on the message.
- You can scroll up or down by swiping your finger in the opposite direction.
- 6. You can star messages to be viewed or searched separately, making them easier to locate.
- 7. You can also move messages to a folder to read later or to save them.

# Messaging / Texting



#### How to Send a text message (SMS/MMS)

- Depending in your Android Open one of the above Messaging Icons.
- At the bottom right, touch the compose icon (the pencil).
- Choose New SMS.
- Type in the contact's name or mobile phone number, and touch the number or contact.
- Tap into the message box and the keyboard will appear.
- Type your message and touch the paper airplane send icon.



# Adding Contacts



To Access your Contacts:

- 1. Tap Head Icon
- 2. Tap + to Add a Contact
- 3. Tap star to make that contact a favorite
- 4. Tap Groups to make add Contacts to a Group
- Fill in first name, last name, mobile phone number, email address, mailing address, birthday

## ICE Contacts

#### ICE = In Case of Emergency

- 1. Tap on Contacts App
- 2. Tap the name of the Contact that you want to add ICE to
- 3. Tap Edit
- 4. Tap into the Company field
- 5. Type ICE
- 6. Tap Done
- You can also tap to add anything else that you that you want to add to that persons Contact card
- Always remember to Tap Done when you are done adding or editing.

Google Maps

Step-by-step navigation, and place searches Get directions to and from a starting point and ending location

- 1. Type in your address
- 2. Tap Start
- 3. The voice will direct you to your location

You can download and save a map

- 1. Touch the search bar at the top of the app
- 2. Scroll to the bottom
- 3. Tap Save Map to use offline

## **Camera Settings**

Change the picture size to4:3 or 16:9.



 Option to turn on grid lines or turn off the loud shutter sound when taking a picture.

Video is set to 1080p 30fps by default
 – this disables HDR video.

# Using the Camera

The Basic Camera has both a still camera and a video camera. 1. Double press the home button to access the camera. 2.Or Select Camera icon or slide finger to video. 3. Hold the device, and aim it at your subject. 4. Then press the camera button to take your photo.

- 3. Tap East Mode



## What is an iPhone?

An iPhone is a smart cell phone, digital camera, and a personal data assistant (PDA), that runs on a mini Macintosh computer iOX operating system. • The iPhone enables its user to surf the Internet, listen to Music, read and send Email, read eBooks, use a GPS, watch a Movie while talking and texting and video chatting on the cell phone.

## iPhone Features

- <u>Battery</u>. has up to 10 hours of talk time, 6 hours of Wi-Fi Internet use, 7 hours of video playback, 24 hours of audio playback and 300 hours of standby time.
- Runs on **Macintosh iOS** (operating system).
- **3.2-8.0 megapixel digital camera.** (depending on your model).
- Capable of shooting Hi-Def video at 30 frames per second.
- Radio transmitters for <u>Bluetooth</u>, <u>Wi-Fi</u> and <u>cellular</u> signals (3G, GSM and EDGE).
- Capable of becoming a **network hotspot** to act as a **modem** for your **PC**.
- 8 GB, 16 GB or 32 GB of storage space, depending on your model.
- The front surface has only one button **The Home button**.
- **Phone.** 4G, LTE, 3G, GSM or EDGE cellular phone service as well as a visual voice.
- Mail. POP and IMAP email access, including HTML capabilities and push email.
- <u>Web</u>. Safari Web browser.
- <u>iPod</u>. Music and videos.
- Video calling with **FaceTime**.
- **Siri. Voice Control** / Accessibility.
- **MMS** (Media Messaging) & **SMS** (Text Messaging) capabilities.





Grey text is always information/instructions and is not clickable.

Grey right facing arrow when tapped takes you to the next page.

A white rectangle or oval shaped box is always a text box. Tap to type. The keyboard will appear.

Black text is a button and can be pressed to get a result.

Red is delete.

**3 Represents a notification.** When over the App Store (number of Apps that have updates). When over Mail (number of new Email messages).

Green or Blue represents - Save.

## The Home Button - bottom

- 1. 1 button on the Front Surface.
- Single press toggles between open Apps and your Home Screen.
- **3. Press and Hold** brings up Siri.



- 4. **Double Press** Reveals Open Apps. Swipe them swipe up to Close.
- Press and Hold to make Apps wiggle > to modify home screen and to make folders.

## The Home Screen

Pressing the Home Button takes you to the Home Screen, page 1.

The tiny little white dots at the bottom of each Home Screen page, just above The Dock - designate your home screen pages.

#### You can have a total of 11 Home Screen pages.

You can have 20 Apps on each page.

4 Apps on The Dock. **The Dock:** is visible on every page. **Place the four Apps that you use most often onto The Dock. Example:** Phone, Notes, Calendar, Email.

#### **Organizing Your Apps**

- Press and hold on one of the App Icons.
- While they are wiggling, Press and hold to Drag them to a new location within each Home Screen, hold them against the right edge of the screen to move them to another Home Screen page and place one App on top of another to form a Folder.
- Folders can contain up to 9-12 Apps. You can have a **total of 2,646 Apps** on your iPhone.
- Folder Example: a Utility folder for your: calculator, tip calculator, currency translator, compass, flashlight and alarm clock.

To Search: Swipe your finger down from the middle of your home screen to Search the iPad.

To bring up your Notifications: swipe your finger down from the time.

### Finger Tapping = Mouse Clicks

- **Tap** and **release** on an App to **Open** that **App**.
- Press and Hold an App to make it wiggle so that you can arrange it.
- Swipe finger down to scroll up / Swipe finger up to scroll down.
- Swipe finger to the left to move right / Swipe finger to the right to move left.
- Pinch your fingers together to zoom out / Start with your fingers together first and then slide them apart to zoom in.
- **Double tap** to **zoom in / Double tap** again to **zoom out.**
- Double tap after typing to make a period.
- Press the Home Button twice to automatically return to your Home Screen from any screen.
- Double Tap the Home Button to raise The Dock (when you are on your first page, designated by the little white dots just above The Dock). Swipe your finger to the right to move through icons. Tap on the Grey circle arrow to LOCK your orientation or adjust your volume.



Designated by the Gray Geer App – let's you adjust ALL of the Settings for your entire device + each App in one convenient place.

- 1. Turn Airplane Mode ON/OFF.
- 2. Connect to a Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 3. Turn Notifications ON.
- 4. Turn Location Services ON.
- 5. You can Set your Sounds: volume limit, set your ringtone, text tone, new voicemail, new mail, sent mail, calendar alerts, keyboard clicks.
- 6. Screen brightness.
- 7. Wallpaper. Lock screen and Home Screen.

# Setting up Wi-Fi

#### 1. Tap Settings

- 2. Tap Wi-Fi (2<sup>nd</sup> choice under Airplane Mode)
- Make sure that Wi-Fi is green (ON) and Ask to Join Networks is green (ON)
- Under Choose a Network > find your desired network name or Tap Other...

# Notifications



- The little white numbers inside red circles that can be found in the upper right corner of your App icons
- Notifications can also be additional email messages > every time an App gets updated, is accessed – you can receive a notification
- Notifications can be seen by swiping downward from the Time on your home screen

#### All About your iPhone

- **1.** Tap Settings > Tap General

### Auto-Lock - Settings

- **Auto Lock** is the time it takes for the iPhone to power down or go to sleep.
- 1. Go to Settings
- 2. Select General
- 3. Tap Auto-Lock >
- 4. Tap your selection
  - 5 minutes, 10 minutes, 15 minutes, 30 minutes, Never (uses a lot of battery life)
- When iPhone is locked, you can still listen to music, adjust the volume, and receive messages and voice mail.
  - **By default,** if you don't touch the screen for a minute, **iPhone** locks automatically.
  - **To Unlock:** Press the Home button, then slide your finger along Slide to Unlock.

#### Passcode Lock

- Passcode Lock is an actual number code or passwrod that you type in to 'Lock' your iPhone after the Auto-Lock 'goes to sleep'.
  - L Go to Settings
  - 2. Select General
  - **3.** Tap Passcode Lock
  - 4. Tap Turn Passcode On
  - **6.** Enter in a **4-digit number** 
    - **1**. Write this number down in your Notes App.
  - 6. Tap Next
  - Note: Every time your iPhone goes to sleep, you will have to enter in your 4-6 digit number before you slide to unlock.

## Wallpaper = Background

- 1. Go to Settings.
- 2. Tap Wallpapers & Brightness.
- 3. Tap Choose a New Wallpaper.
- 4. Tap Dynamic, Tap Stills, or Tap on your Photos.
- 5. Tap desired image.
- 6. Choose from Lock Screen, Home Screen or Both.
- 7. Tap Done.

### Phone



Allows you to make calls, with quick access to recent callers and save favorites. Dial manually using the numeric keypad or use voice dialing. Visual voicemail presents a list of your voicemail messages. Just tap to listen to any message you want, in any order you want.

#### • Tap (green) Phone App

- **Favorites.** Quick dial to favorite contacts.
- **Recents.** Recent phone calls placed and received.
- **Contacts.** Your Address Book.
- **Keypad.** Dial manually.
- VoiceMail.
- When the Contact is listed, the Contacts name will appear.
- If the phone number isn't assigned to a Contact, just the phone number will appear.

- 1. Tap Phone
- 2. Tap Voicemail
- 3. Tap Greeting
- Select either Default or Custom
- If Custom, Tap Record, Speak
- Save
- Tap Number or Name
- To Listen to Message, Tap
- Tap to Add number to existing contact or to Create a new contact
- To Return Call Back Tap
- To Delete, Tap

## Voice Memos



Record voice memos and then play them back or sync them with iTunes to listen to them on your computer.

Attach voice memos to email or MMS messages.

- **1. Tap the Red circle to record**
- 2. Tap the triple black equal sign to stop recording
- Tap the triple black equal sign to listen, share or delete a voice memo

#### Add Phone Numbers

#### To add a Phone Number to a Contact:

- **1.** Tap Phone or Message
- 2. Tap on the little blue i
- 3. If this is a new contact for your address book >
  - Tap Create New Contact
  - Tap Done
- 4. If this person already exists >
  - Tap Add to Existing Contact
  - Find the person and Tap on their name
  - Tap Done when finished

### Who is Siri?

- Siri is the intelligent personal assistant that helps you get things done just by asking.
- "She" or "He" allows you to use your voice to give simple commands to send messages, schedule meetings, place phone calls, and more.
- **Siri** understands your natural speech, and will ask you questions if she needs more information to complete a task.
- **Siri** uses the processing power of the dual-core A5 chip and your WiFi network to communicate with Apple's data centers.
- She can quickly understand what you say and what you're asking for, then quickly return a response.
- The more you use Siri, the better she will understand you. She does this by learning about your accent and other characteristics of your voice.

# **Using Siri**

- 1. Tap the "Settings" icon.
- 2. Tap "General".
- 3. Tap "Siri".
- 4. Tap the grey circle to the right of Siri to turn her ON. When the circle turns green you have enabled her.
- 5. Tap Allow "Hey Siri". Follow the instructions.
- 6. Tap Done when prompted.
- 7. Set your language.
- 8. Set Siri's Voice.
- 9. Voice Feedback preference.
- 10. My Info. \* You must have already added your Info to your contacts.

To Access Siri > Press and Hold the Home Button.

- 2. Ask her to search contacts or call a contact.
- 3. Ask Siri to send a text message.

#### Siri Dictation

- Use your voice, instead of typing
- Tap the microphone icon on the keyboard. Then say what you want to say.
- Tap Done, and Siri will convert your words into text.
  - Use dictation to write messages, take notes, search the web, write an email.
  - Dictation also works with third-party apps, so you can update your Facebook status, tweet, or write and send Instagrams.

### iMessage



#### iMessage let's you send text messages for free to and from other Apple devices over Wi-Fi.

- 1. Tap on the green and white **Message App**.
- 2. Tap on the pencil.
- 3. Tap to type the person's name or a 10 digit phone number. You can also tap the + sign that will take you to your Contacts and then tap on the Contact that you are texting to.
- 4. Tap to type your message in the rounded text box.
- 5. Tap on the camera to attach a photo.
- 6. Press send when you are finished.

Go to Settings > Messages > turn on iMessage (green) > Add your email addresses and cell number that you can be reached at.

#### Voice Texts

- iMessage can now send voice messages.
- Just press and hold the little record button in the bottom right of your iMessage and record a message to send to a friend.
- To listen to a voice message, just press the play button or hold the iPhone up to your ear.



### Face Time



- FaceTime lets you see your favorite faces more and miss them a little less.
- **Just tap FaceTime** to call another Apple device:
  - iPhone, iPad 2, iPod touch, or Mac over Wi-Fi.

#### Two cameras made for video calling.

- The front camera is configured for FaceTime.
- It has just the right field of view and focal length to focus on your face at arm's length. So it always presents you in the best possible light.

# Using the Mail App



- Tap Mail icon to open Mail App
- Swipe your finger downward on top of your In Box to Get New Mail
- Flag icon; moves message to junk or marks message as read
- **Folder icon**; saves or moves messages to specified folder that you can create on your mail server
- Trash can; deletes Mail
- Left direction arrow; Reply, Forward or Print an open message
- **Pencil box**; composes new email messages
- To delete a message:
  - 1. Press Edit > tap your finger into little open circle or
  - 2. Swipe your sideways to the left on top of message that you want to delete

### **Easier Emailing**

- Email is a lot simpler.
- Swiping left now lets you tap "more", "flag", or "trash".
- If you swipe right, you can "mark as unread".

## Copy & Paste

- 3. Tap on Select (drag the anchor points to select more or less text) or Select All.
- 4. Press and hold on text over word to move blinking vertical cursor between the letters to desired location.
- 5. Tap Copy.
- 6. Tap the App of where you want to copy your text to.
- 7. Double Tap when you see the blinking vertical cursor, Tap Paste.
- 8. To Undo: Shake iPad and tap Undo.

# Editing Text

- To Select text:
  - 1. Touch and hold on text to bring up the magnifying glass.
  - Choose Select to select some text or Select All to select all text.
  - 8. Drag the blue anchor points to select more or less text.
  - 4. Select Cut, Copy or Paste.
    - **1**. Cut = moves selected text.
    - 2. Copy = copies selected text.
    - **3.** Paste = pastes selected text.
  - Double Tap inside App where you want to Paste your selected text.
  - 6. Select Paste.

#### The Camera

Take photos, and record videos. View them, email them, upload them to your computer. Trim and save video clips. Upload videos directly to YouTube. Take a friend's picture and add that photo to their Contact page.

- 1. Tap on the Camera App
- 2. Select still photo or video
- 3. Hold up your device and aim it toward whatever it is that you want to photograph or video



# A few Tips

**Double tapping the space bar** = a period (.), followed by a space – the next letter will automatically be capitalized.

**Double tapping the up arrow on the keyboard** = caps lock key.

**Tapping the time on the status bar at the top** = will automatically bring you to the top of the screen or page.

**Pressing and holding and swiping your finger down from the time** = will bring down your notifications.


